

Technical Tour Option One - Airport Tour

Description:

This guided tour is an exciting opportunity to have a closer look at the Christchurch International Airport and go 'airside' to see the back of terminal operations. Christchurch Airport as a key transport node in relation to domestic and international travel as well as cargo freight. In addition to learning about the internal workings of the terminal, you will also have the chance to look at the wider transport network around the airport and discover how the airport is being integrated with the surrounding area which is undergoing a substantial amount of growth. The tour will include the nearby commercial developments of Dakota Park and Mustang Park. Please note that delegates wishing to attend this tour will be required to provide a photocopy of their driver's license to be filled as photo ID.

Description: Cycle tour visiting future planned cycle routes



Description:

Christchurch is implementing 13 major cycleway routes over the coming years. Major cycleways aim to cater for both adults and children (10 years and over), will provide safe links to popular destinations and key activity centres and offer the highest level of service to cyclists. This is an exciting project for Christchurch!

This cycle tour will take you on pleasant ride through Hagley Park and Riccarton Bush via the planned **Uni-Cycle route** to the University of Canterbury. From the University the tour will head south along the planned **Nor'West Arc route** and then hook up to the **Little River Link** leading back to south end of Hagley Park. The route will feature elements of separated cycleways, neighbourhood greenways and shared pathways. The ride will take a leisurely 1.5 hours, with plenty of stops along the way to point out cycleway features past, present and future. The tour guides will explain the planning and design challenges encountered along the way. This tour will appeal to people involved in the implementation of cycleways and those who just like to cycle!



Technical Tour Option Three - CBD Anchor Projects Bus Tour

Description: Bus tour visiting 17 anchor projects and precincts

What to bring: Closed footwear is essential.

Description:

This 1.5 hour tour will be circumnavigate the central city focusing on many of the 17 Anchor Projects and Precincts that are the basis of the Christchurch Central Recovery Plan. Attendees will be treated to knowledgeable commentary on the objectives and progress of the anchor project and their impact on the Christchurch transport system by CERA's Principal Transport Planner, Angus Bargh and Project Manager - Anchor Projects, James Parker.

The exact tour route and stopping points will be determined by accessibility and current construction site restrictions at the time however of particular interest from a transport perspective is 'Accessible City' which is the transport network within Christchurch's four avenues. This project is set to lead transformational change and will create a network that will significantly improve the safety, ease and enjoyment of moving around the city and provide a connection between the anchor projects. The Bus Interchange, Avon River Precinct, Margaret Mahy Amazing Place Playground, North Frame Public Realm, Health Precinct, Justice and Emergency Services Precinct, Innovation Precinct, South Frame Public Realm, Central Library, the Performing Arts Precinct, and the Hagley Cricket Oval, are all programmed to be complete or under construction during the tour.

The tour will take you past the Cardboard Cathedral, and past some of the new large scale developments (Transport Interchange and Justice Precinct). Observe close hand some of the buildings still to be demolished, and experience some of the Gap Filler projects to keep the central city active. Try the "Large Green Chair", tap out a few beats on the disco floor, or enjoy a refreshing coffee from one of the many coffee establishments along the way.

A great way to spend the afternoon and capture a piece in time. Closed toe shoes are required, hat and sunblock a must.
